Kenya

A future Habitat Kenya homeowner and her daughter stand next to the makeshift tent they currently occupy, situated next to the construction site of their future Habitat house. The family has been living in a tent since their home in Narok, Kenya, was destroyed during the periods of violence in December 2007 and January 2008 that followed a disputed national election. The family was among the thousands forced to flee their homes areas as a result of the conflict. Now, they are part of a self-help group of internally displaced people (IDP) that collectively purchased land in the area in which they now live. The group is partnering with Habitat Kenya to build houses on the land (right).
